



RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR OBTAINING AND INSTALLING PRIVATE METERS FOR SINGLE FAMILY DWELLINGS WITH AN UN-METERED PRIVATE WELL

Montgomery Township ordinance 12-10.4, allows for owners of single family dwellings served by a private well to install, at the owner's cost and expense, additional water meter(s) in accordance with the following rules and regulations.

To ensure uniformity, meters shall be obtained from the Engineering Department at the Engineering Department's cost plus shipping. Current costs are as follows:

5/8" x 3/4"	\$110.00
3/4" x 3/4"	\$142.00
1" x 1"	\$184.00
3/4" meter couplings	\$11.00/ pair
1" meter couplings	\$15.00/ pair

A licensed plumbing contractor should be consulted on the proper location of the meter and should verify that the entire system that is tributary to the sanitary sewer system is metered. The licensed plumber will determine the required meter size.

Residents must first obtain a plumbing permit from the Construction Code Department. Once the meter is installed and the plumbing inspector issues a passing inspection report, the Code Department will notify the Finance Department that the meter has been installed. At this point, an initial reading shall be taken and the results reported to the Finance Department on the attached form.

Thereafter, readings shall be reported to the Finance Department no later than December 31 each year. Annual readings shall be taken between December 15 and 31. The Township will read the meter and add a \$100 charge to the annual bill if the annual reading is not submitted.

The Township reserves the right to spot check the meters at any time between the hours of 8a.m. and 6 p.m., and recalculate the charges in the event the unit owner submits an inaccurate meter reading to the Township.

Sewer fees will be billed based upon the private meter readings after at least six months of data.
